- Explore partnerships


Reasons to Present Work in Progress – Be Specific





Story vs. Journal Article

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- Motivation
- Sense of purpose
- Foregrounds conflict
- Engages Audience

1. Brief Anecdote

- Get us to care
- Help us understand the human problem
- Show us, don't simply tell


1. Brief Anecdote - Ideas



- Personal story
- •Something you read in the news
- •[Anonymized] story about a study participant
- •Start with a specific example and then connect it to larger statistics


2. Status Quo World

- Show us how things currently are in your topic
- Only as much "lit review" as necessary



2. Status Quo World - Ideas

- What scholars currently say (that you want to prove wrong)
- What currently policy is (that you want to change)
- What current treatments are for the condition you study (that you want to improve)




3. Problem with Status Quo

- Articulate the problem with the status quo and, thus, **your motivation**
- Lay out the stakes of the problem



4. Plan for Your Journey of Discovery

- Show us how you intend to solve the mystery, find solutions, or answer your questions
- What's new about what you're doing?





5. Terrain Traversed in Plan So Far

- Show us what you've done/what you know so far
- Be selective!

6. Where your investigation is hitting roadblocks

Goal:

• Help us better understand the questions you have for us



7. Happy Conclusion

- What you found and how it has the potential to affect the status quo for the better (research impact)
- What new questions have been identified





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


Mobilize the Audience to Help

Goals:

• Enable us to answer questions you established at the beginning
