UVA **announced plans** (<https://news.virginia.edu/content/uva-plans-new-school-data-science-120-million-gift-largest-university-history>) to establish a School of Data Science – an effort made possible by the largest private gift in the University's 200-year history.

The school aims to position the University as a global leader in efforts to improve society through teaching and research grounded in the powerful, emerging field of data science.

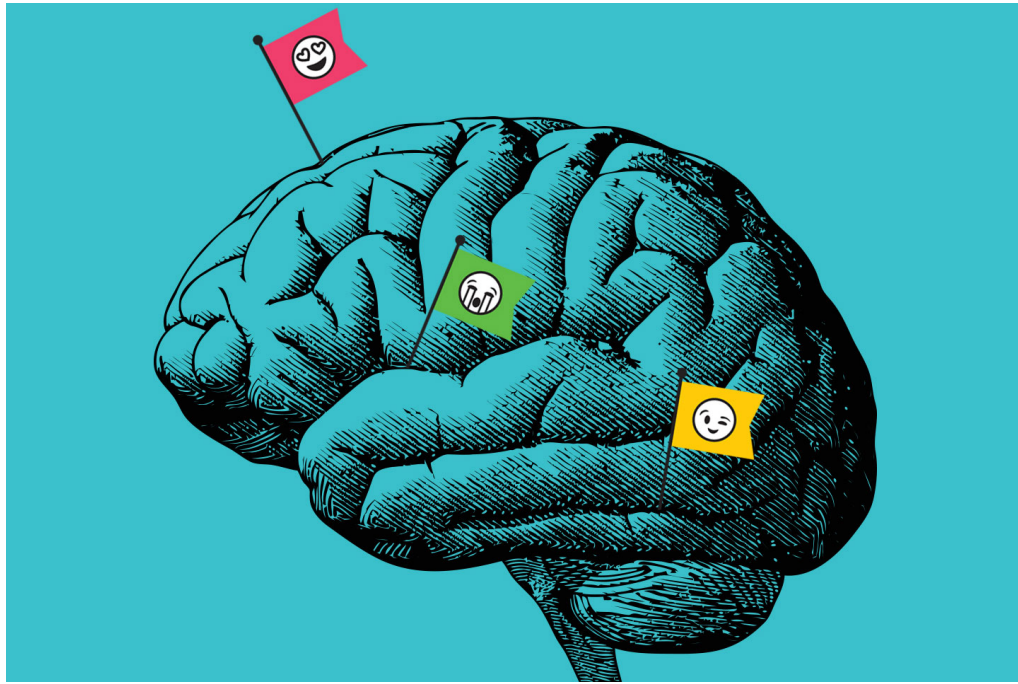

UVA announced a **new admission option**
